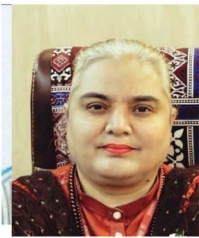

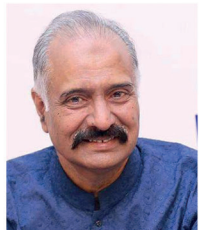

History & Creation of Alumni

- Established in 1917, Government College, Hyderabad is one of Pakistan's oldest institutions, with alumni serving across the nation and abroad. Fond memories of their college days evoke pride and happiness whenever they reunite.
- Recognizing the need for an organization, many former students felt it was time to establish a platform for annual gatherings, where they could exchange views, relive memories, and collaborate on welfare projects for mutual benefit, and supporting those facing genuine challenges.
- In pursuit of this goal, alumni of Government College, Hyderabad convened on 29 January, 1998 and created the Alumni Association, Government College, Hyderabad. This independent, non-political, and non-profit organization focuses on fostering connections, preserving memories, and developing welfare initiatives.



Prof: Dr. Tayyaba Zarif has made history as the first permanent **Vice Chancellor of Government College Hyderabad University**, appointed based on merit after interviews by the Sindh chief minister. Her selection addresses the need for a public sector university in Hyderabad, the second-largest city in Sindh. The elevation of Government College Kali Mori to university status, with Dr. Zarif as Vice Chancellor, marks a significant step, particularly as she is the first female to hold this position. Dr. Zarif, previously the acting vice chancellor of Nawabshah University, brings a wealth of experience. With an academic background including an MA in Education from Karachi University and subsequent MPhil and PhD, her leadership is transforming Government College University Hyderabad (GCUH) into an emerging brand of higher education in Sindh. The university has even achieved recognition in international rankings within a remarkably short time under her guidance.

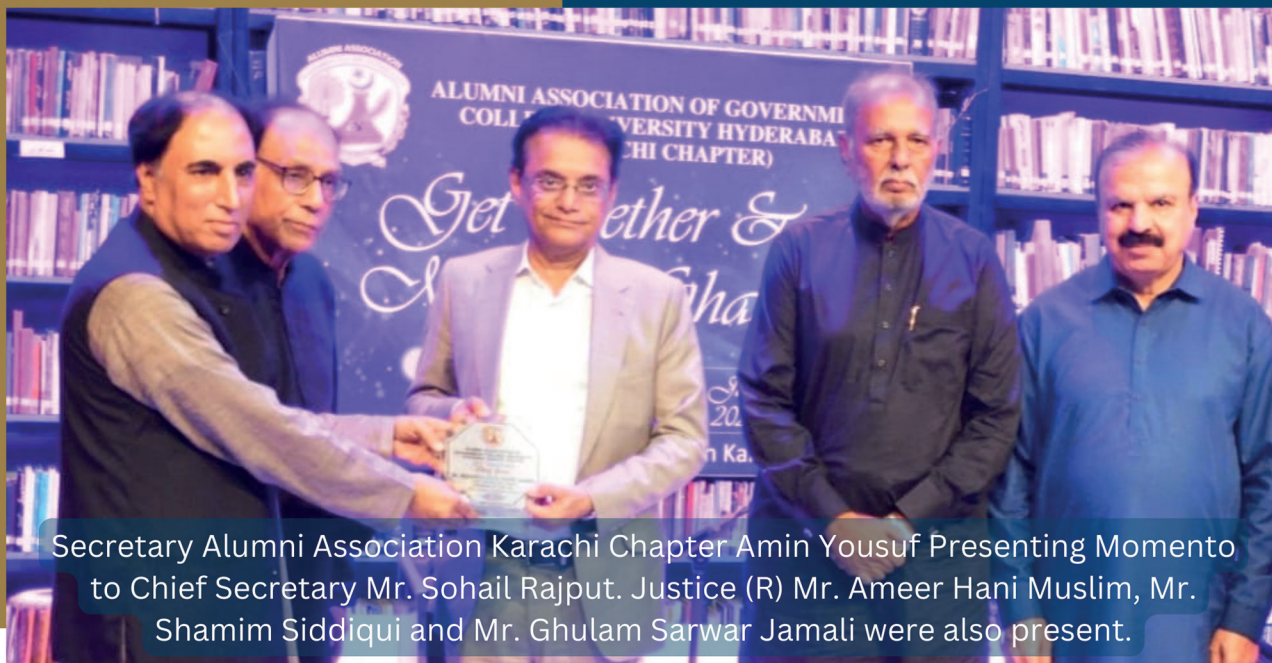

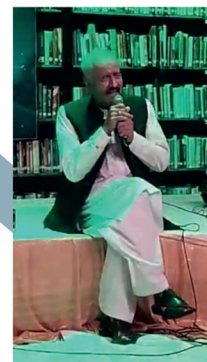
Amin Yusuf, Secretary of Karachi Chapter, shed light on the future programs and said that the chapter of Alumni Association has been fully activated.

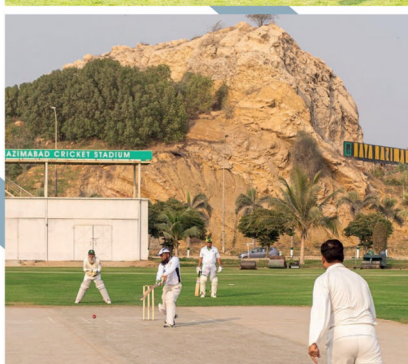

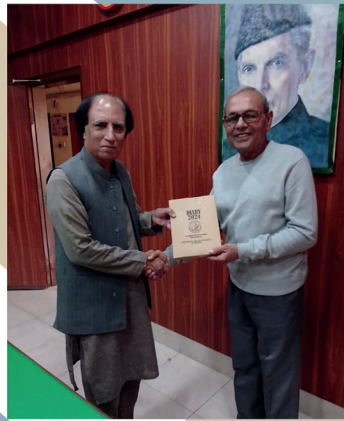

Proud Phulellians



Anwar Zaheer Jamali, a distinguished legal luminary and a devoted Phulellian, left an indelible mark on the judicial landscape of Pakistan. Serving as the 24th Chief Justice of Pakistan, his unwavering commitment to principles became evident early in his career when he refused to take a fresh oath under the Provisional Constitutional Order, earning widespread acclaim.

Born in Hyderabad (Sindh) to parents who migrated from Jaipur, India in 1947, Jamali embarked on his academic journey at the University of Sindh. In 1971, he earned his bachelor's degree in Commerce, followed by a bachelor's degree in Law in 1973 from the same institution. His legal prowess and dedication to justice were recognized as he enrolled as an Advocate of the Lower Court in 1975, progressing to become an Advocate of the Sindh High Court in 1977. In 1987, he reached the pinnacle of his legal career by being enrolled as an Advocate of the Supreme Court. Beyond his judicial responsibilities, Jamali played pivotal roles, including serving as the Acting Chief Election Commissioner of Pakistan and as the Chief Justice of the Sindh High Court. In 1995, his peers elected him Chairman of the Executive Committee of the Sindh Bar Council.



Justice Ghulam Rabbani, born on October 20, 1944, in Hyderabad, Sindh, is a distinguished legal figure. Graduating with distinctions in Arts from the University of Sindh, he also earned his LLB from the same institution. A fellow of the Commonwealth Judicial Institute in Canada, he imparted legal knowledge as a teacher at Hyderabad Sindh Government Law College since 1965. Justice Rabbani's legal journey includes practicing as an Advocate before subordinate Courts and the High Court. He served as Additional Advocate General Sindh in 1996-1997 and held key roles in bar associations, such as Joint Secretary and General Secretary of the Hyderabad District Bar Association. His contributions extend beyond the courtroom, including membership in the Federal Review Board, Chairman of the Selection Committee for Judicial Officers in Sindh, and roles in various educational and civic boards. Elevated as a Judge of the High Court of Sindh in 1998, Justice Rabbani later became an ad-hoc judge in the Supreme Court of Pakistan in 2006. Notably, he was a member of the Bench in 2007 that ordered not to take an oath under the Provisional Constitutional Order (P.C.O).



Justice Rtd Amir Hani Muslim, known for his outspoken and courageous stance as a judge. In August 2002, he was appointed as a Judge of the Sindh High Court and gained prominence. In a pivotal moment in Pakistan's constitutional history in November 2007, Justice Hani Muslim emerged as a beacon of judicial independence. Faced with the Provisional Constitution Order (PCO), a challenge to the autonomy of the judiciary, he, along with other steadfast judges, refused to take the oath under its provisions. This resolute stand not only showcased his personal integrity but also underscored his commitment to upholding the sanctity of the legal system. His commitment to upholding the rule of law led to his elevation as a Supreme Court judge in February 2011. Justice Hani's roots trace back to Kotri in District Dadu. In addition to his judicial career, he also served as the Chairman of the Water Commission Sindh, demonstrating his dedication to addressing critical issues in the region. Justice Rtd Amir Hani Muslim's career is a testament to his principled and courageous approach to the judiciary. From his early days as a Judge of the Sindh High Court to his elevation to the Supreme Court, he has consistently demonstrated a commitment to justice, the rule of law, and public service, both in the courtroom and in addressing critical regional issues.

Proud Phulellians



Raja Pervaiz Ashraf, a prominent Pakistani politician, businessman, and agriculturist, has been serving as the Speaker of the National Assembly since April 2022. Previously, he held the position of the 19th Prime Minister of Pakistan from June 22, 2012, to March 16, 2013, completing his designated term. Before assuming the role of Prime Minister, Ashraf served as the Minister for Water and Power and was actively involved in politics as the Secretary General of the PPP. Born and raised in Sanghar, Sindh, where his parents owned agricultural land, Ashraf graduated from the Government College Hyderabad and the University of Sindh in 1970. Initially engaged in agriculture, he later entered politics and was twice elected as a Member of the National Assembly (MNA) from Gujar Khan, Rawalpindi District. Ali, known for his charisma, pursued higher studies at Government College and City College, Hyderabad. His career began at Radio Pakistan in 1956, initially in Hyderabad and later in Bahawalpur and Karachi. Making his film debut in "Chiragh Jalta Raha" (1962), Ali went on to star in 94 films, earning him recognition as one of the greatest actors in Asia. His cinematic journey began with "Shararat" (1963), leaving an enduring legacy in the world of Pakistani cinema.
